



IMPORTANT INFORMATION: SWIMMING POOL

With the commencement of the school year, the school pool is available from:

Monday - Friday 3.15 pm - 7.30 pm

Weekends from 9 am - 7.30 pm

Access to the swimming pool is via the car park entrance by the gymnasium. The library car park entrance is no longer available as an entry point/car park to the swimming pool.

Unfortunately during the holiday period there was some vandalism caused in the toilet area, and we had to ask one of our support workers to come in and clean up the mess, our caretaker is also attending to the graffiti. Rubbish is being left in the pool enclosure as well.

As a school we wish to provide this service to you by making the pool available to the community over the summer period however, it becomes increasingly difficult when the facilities are not being looked after properly and will certainly warrant further consideration for the future of it being kept opened.

We are hoping that over this term with hot weather continuing to be forecast that everyone will keep an 'eye' out on the pool and toilet areas.

Going forward we ask you to ensure the following -

- Only pool users with a key are entitled to use the pool. As the registered key holder you must accompany
 any person(s) going swimming and may be asked to present your key
- Keep all food or drink outside of the pool enclosure. Please use all rubbish bins outside of the pool area.
- Observe the opening and closing times of the pool
- Keep the toilet areas clean

BEE HIVES



SCHOOL BUS AND ROAD SAFETY CHANGES

3:00pm - 3:15pm. In response to a rising volume of traffic, both vehicle and human, the college has actioned a change in how bus students and pedestrians manage themselves at this time of day. At 3:00pm, our first 3 buses line up outside the school in the same order each day and students who travel on these buses: Parahi, Okahu, and Te Kowhai make their way directly to their bus. Students who are travelling on Matakohe and Toka Toka buses wait in a designated area, outside H-Block, with the Bus Duty Teacher. Any student who needs to cross over the state highway to the parking/pickup area must also wait in the designated area. Once these two buses have parked safely the Bus Duty Teacher brings the remaining students to the bus bay. Bus students make their way to their respective bus, and all other students are crossed safely by the Bus Duty Teacher. If parents are picking up their child after school, please be aware that there is a wait time of about 5 7 minutes before students are crossed over the road to the parking area. We respectfully request that any adults at the college at this time also wait and cross with the students, as this reduces the amount of foot traffic crossing the road and allows a better flow of vehicle traffic.
