#### **RUAWI COLLEGE BYOD:**

#### What is BYOD?

Ruawai College believes that the use of devices in class will supplement and enhance the learning of our students. By going fully BYOD Ruawai College will be ensuring that our students have access to a wider range of resources, a more personalised learning experience, as well as increasing motivation and engagement. By being a BYOD school we are promoting co-operative, inquiry based learning and a partnership between home and school.

#### What protection does the school offer?

The school takes no responsibility for devices that are damaged during the school day. It is up to the student to be responsible with their device and to take care of it.

Hardware - Insurance for the devices can be purchased through the retailer, however this will be done at the parents expense. The device will need an adequate storage bag which the students will be in charge of throughout the school day.



Cell Phones will no longer be considered an acceptable device for classroom use.



Junior students are able to use chormebooks as their chosen device.



All devices will need to be protected by a suitable bag, sleeve or case.



Seniors will need to have a laptop or notebook.



All devices will need to be charged at home so that they will last a full school day.



All suitable devices will be added to the school will and student's will sign an internet usage agreement

Software - Once the device is put onto the school network it will have the same restrictions on the school computers. This means that harmful websites will be monitored and blocked while the student is using the school network.

#### Will there be devices at the school for my child to use?

We do have some Google chromebooks and laptops for use across the school, however, one cannot always rely on their availability/access.

#### **Possible Devices**


Classes require a device that allows students to access the internet. Students will use the devices for a variety of tasks and will need to have a screen size of at least 10" and a full keyboard. A chromebook for Juniors or laptop for Seniors is the preferred device, although a tablet with a Bluetooth keyboard would also be acceptable.

#### Why a Chromebook?

In short, Chromebooks are a cost effective solution that offer the tools we need to deliver a true 21st century educational experience. Chromebooks are essentially internet only devices. Chromebooks offered what we feel is the best option for collaboration and sharing using the educational tools provided by Google and other companies.

#### Are only Chromebooks supported?

We have actually been a BYOD school for some time. We have a number of senior students, and some juniors, who bring various devices for use in a range of classes. However, as we look to have entire classes using devices, we needed to balance the educational needs of students with the realities of a classroom. We do not have a technician for every classroom and teachers cannot plan lessons for every type of device. By selecting Chromebooks as our default device, teachers can plan more effectively and we can support the technical side of configuring and managing student devices.

#### **Gateway First Aid**

The Gateway programme is designed to strengthen pathways for students from school to further education and training or employment by providing them with opportunities to access structured workplace learning. Our Gateway programme began this year on 30 January with a One Day Workplace First Aid Course where students were put into action in a variety of scenario-based learning activities. This should prepare them well for their work placements that will commence in Term 2 from 8 to 12 June. Along with this all students who are participating in Gateway this year have work booklets to complete that are due by the end of Term one. Other Health and Safety and customer service courses will be offered throughout the year. If you are an employer and are interested in providing a work placement for one of our students, please contact the school office.









#### Term 1 2020 HEALTH PROGRAMMES

The New Zealand Curriculum states that the focus of health is on the well-being of the students themselves, of other people, and of society through learning in health-related contexts. Four concepts are at the heart of this learning area: Hauora/Wellbeing, Attitudes and Values, Socio-ecological Perspective and Health Promotion. Within health and physical education, we are also expected to cover the seven key areas of learning. These are mental health, sexuality education, food and nutrition, body care and physical safety, physical activity, sport studies, outdoor education.

This year the health topics to be taught alongside the PE curriculum in school include:

#### Year 7:

- Term 1 Positive classrooms investigate the qualities of friendships and how to maintain friends.
- **Term 1** Dreams exploring their interests and achievements and how these may affect their lifestyle.

Year 8:

- Term 1 Forever friends identifying features of a healthy friendship, how these affect feelings of self worth.
- Term 1- Communication exploring a range of communication methods and how to behave assertively in a variety of situations.

#### Year 9:

 Term 1 - Hauora – Exploring an adolescent's total wellbeing including dental hygiene, skin problems (acne), body odour and puberty.

#### Year 10:

• **Term 1** - Safety - Road and Water – investigating and understanding the importance of being a responsible road user. Investigating and taking action around a road/boat safety issue.

Senior Health: Although there are no specific health classes run at the senior level from time to time throughout the year, we have outside educators come in and run courses in a range of the key learning areas. This year these include:

- RYDA Road Safety Education. Educating the 'whole student', providing a unique opportunity to learn essential life skills as they face the challenges of driving solo or as an influential passenger of a novice driver.
- Year 11 Attitude (Outside Presenter) Sex with Attitude discussing the emotional and social aspects of sexuality and provide a decision-making guide to relationships. The programme covers the benefits of postponing sexual involvement, and how to set boundaries. It challenges teenagers to think about the options for their future.
- Year 12/13 Attitude (Outside Presenter) The Pitts (Mental Health) This is a survival kit for handling the bad times, and covers grief and loss, depression and stress.

#### PEER SUPPORT

Peer support is a personal development programme for secondary students, the purpose is twofold. #### **Prefect Leadership Programme**

On Wednesday 29th January the Deputy Principal Mrs M Sandhu and our Assistant Principal Mr T.Raeli organised a training session for our 2020 Prefects.

The session focussed on the three values of Ruawai College Respect, Resilience, and Responsibility. The leaders have suggested a motivational quote for themselves that can guide and represent them to show who we are (Ruawai Leadership) as a group providing service to the community and our nation.

There were activities that guided them to plan the steps to be taken while collectively working as a team, critically analyse a situation prior to carrying out a task, and show collective accountability while working as a cohesive team. Lots of fun and lots of learning filled the day.

# **Property Work Ruawai College**

#### **School Bus and Road Safety**

3:00pm - 3:15pm. In response to the rising volume of traffic, both vehicles and humans, the college has actioned procedures in how bus students and pedestrians manage themselves at this time of the day.

At 3:00pm, our first 3 buses line up outside the school in the same order each day and students who travel on these busses: Parahi, Okahu, Te Kowhai make their way directly to their bus. Students who are on the Matakohe, Dargaville and Toka Toka buses wait in a designated area outside H-Block, with the Bus Duty Teacher.

Any student who needs to cross over the state highway to the parking and pick up area must also wait in the designated area. Once the last 3 buses have parked safely the Bus Duty Teacher brings the remaining students to the bus bay. Bus students make their way to their respective bus, and all the other students are crossed safely by the Bus Duty Teacher.

If parents are picking their child up after school, please be aware that there is a wait time of about 5 - 7 minutes before students are crossed over the road to the parking area. We respectfully request that any adults at the college at this time also wait and cross with the students, as this reduces the amount of foot traffic crossing the road and allows a better flow of vehicle traffic.

#### **Casual Use Agreement**

#### **SKOOLLOOP APP**

Ruawai College has an app. This app is available on both apple and android devices and can be downloaded from the app store or google play.

The App allows users to get important notices via notifications on their device, whilst also being able to see events on the school calendar. It gives the user the ability to see newsletters and email student absences. Download and try it today.



#### STUDENTS BRINING A VEHICLE TO SCHOOL



Students may drive to school and park in the gym car park, provided they have either a Restricted or Full license. Before bringing a car to school students must provide a copy of their license and complete a permission slip signed by their parent/caregiver. It is at the discretion of the Senior Leadership Team whether students have permission to have a vehicle at school. Students are required to hand their keys in to the office on arrival and must travel alone unless they are permitted to carry passengers.

#### THE HUB

Te Manawa Tahi (The Hub) is a learning support hub where you can come in and talk to education professionals about your child's learning needs. Learning Support (formerly Special Education and the RTLB service (Resource Teachers Learning and Behaviour) have teamed up with schools/kura, early childhood, iwi and community providers to work together with the sole purpose of providing support for your tamariki and their learning needs.

The Hub will be across at the Ruawai Primary on Thursday 13 February from 8:30am-12:30pm, you are more than welcome to drop in or you can make an appointment to arrange to see a specialist. Please contact them on 0800 5248 4256 or email TT.Support@education.govt.nz

#### **BUS - DARGAVILLE TO RUAWAI**

Ruawai College is pleased to confirm that the Dargaville to Ruawai College return bus will be continuing throughout 2020. The bus will travel direct to Ruawai from Dargaville but this year we have included a stop at the old Mititai shop on the corner of Mititai Road and State Highway 12 if needed.

This service is heavily subsidised by the Ruawai College Board of Trustees for Ruawai College students who purchase a term pass. This service is optional so all fares including term passes must be paid in full and in advance. No fare can be put on account unless it is done in advance, so the full fare is paid prior to the service being required. No student can board the bus unless a ticket or pass has been purchased.

Casual fares and Concession tickets are available for all students including Ruawai Primary students at a set fee. Again, these tickets must be purchased prior to boarding the bus.

TICKET COSTS

TERM PASS

1 Ruawai College student per term - \$150 per student

- 2 Ruawai College students from the same family per term \$280 for both
- 3 or more Ruawai College students from the same family per term \$400 for all students

CASUAL FARE \$5 per student per trip

CONCESSION TICKET \$30 per student for 10 trips

The bus leaves Dargaville at 8am from Victoria Street, Dargaville adjacent to the Warehouse car park and returns the children to the same place at approximately 3.30pm. Any Arapohue students will be collected from the Mititai shop area at approximately 8.10am and dropped off at the Mititai shop area at approximately 3.20pm.
