Te Wiki o Te Reo Maori Language Week

On Monday staff were presented with a model waka when they discussed the Maori origins of the language along with similar words from



Hawaii, Samoa and Tahiti. Students were presented with a reading of the Mahuhu ki Te Rangi waka that arrived in the Kaipara, captained by Rongomai the Navigator.

On Tuesday students competed in a photo competition where they had a list of 20 Maori words and had to find examples of the words around the school.

Wednesday saw a Te Reo Maori quiz for students during LA classes where a handful of students reached 100% correct which was fantastic.

On Thursday students were asked to create their pepeha (identity presentation) and become familiar with our school's pepeha. Staff were treated with the modern Maori food, fry bread made by Annissa Thompson from the Well Cafe which was thoroughly enjoyed- not one piece was left!

On Friday the school focus was on the taiaha. Discussing the different parts of the taiaha and its uses. On this day students practiced the school haka and waiata to close the week.




