### **CURRICULUM**

### **ENGLISH**

We have all been reading about the 'Literacy Crisis' in the national newspapers and wondering what it might mean for our akonga as they progress through their senior school

Teachers in the English Department are currently directing their full attention to the lifting of literacy skills to aid learning across the curriculum. The big message is that while the problem is an international one it inevitably has to be tackled at the individual level; as each student has their interests, aspirations, and obstacles. This is especially the case for senior students who struggle with subject-specific reading and written expression. Recently the school has implemented a programme of learning through the IXL cloud-based platform so that learning can continue beyond the school gate. This is particularly important given the recent battle between COVID-19 and the usual expectations of progress in learning for each year group.

We are also promoting the free programme 'ReadTheory', with consistent use this interactive teaching tool will support the strengthening of reading skills in all subjects across the student population. Importantly, despite the predominance of the digital worldview, all teachers of English commit to connecting students with the written, spoken, and viewed world (particularly film) that make up the richness of everyday life.

Next week we have a group of 10 students attending the Auckland Writers Festival and we intend to continuously seek out opportunities for students to experience the widest range of cultural and language-based activities; whether it be debating, public speaking, or writing competitions, or performances. We wish our Senior students all the best for their NCEA external examinations and would invite parents to be mindful of the stresses these often create for the tamariki!














While running through the paddocks we had to run through heaps of mud pools and climb up and over the obstacles and crawl through tunnels.
















VOTE
