

CURRICULUM



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The Health and Physical Education Department has had some changes of which we would like to inform you about. The first being a change in staff. We welcome Hayley Corfield who is teaching the Year 7 cohort, our new Sports Coordinator, Helena Thompson and myself, now teaching the Year 8 cohort, the modules for Year 9/10 cohort and our Seniors. The Hauora programme for Year 9 and 10 is being taught by Jenny Dallison and Kimberley Rope-Battcher.

There has been an exciting change within the PE programme with the implementation of Modules for the Years 9/10 allowing the students to choose which areas they would like to participate in. Learning Packages have been developed for the seniors which provides them with the choice of doing a full PE course, allowing for subject endorsement, or opting into a term if the subject is supporting their career journey.

There have been many highlights over the year with students attending trips and events that support the modules and shared experiences. The Year 9/10 got to experience the Ninja Warrior course at Jump which tested their strength and resilience. The seniors have participated in many outdoor adventures with Tree Climbing, Surfing, Archery and a Lakes trip for Paddleboarding and Kayaking. They also had the choice to participate in the Tough Guy Gal Challenge, a 6km mud run which tested their endurance. The main highlight was probably the Hillary Outdoors experience which developed leadership skills and team work. The students got to sleep overnight on Mount Ruapehu which was extremely cold but an experience that they will never forget.

All these events our students participate in and also our PE classes are developing the key competencies in our curriculum. These are Participating and Contributing, Relating to Others, Managing Self, Using Language in a physical education context, and Thinking skills. Many of these skills are what our students need for when they move onto the journey of life. So to our parents, whanau, and community encourage our students to participate, learn and enjoy being a part of a team or being involved in the many sporting activities we offer.

CURRICULUM TECHNOLOGY

Technology is invention by design. With its focus on design thinking, technology education supports students to be innovative, reflective and critical in designing new models, products, software, systems and tools to benefit people while taking account of their impact on cultural, ethical, environmental and economic conditions.

At Ruawai College, Technology is taught through the subjects Digital Technology, Hard Materials Technology and Food and Fabric Technology (which also incorporates Home Economics/Hospitality from the Health Curriculum) All of these subjects are taught from Year 7 to 13.

In 2022 the Junior Modules have enabled the technology department to think outside the square and incorporate some new learning, the modules included Great Outdoors, Wooden Toys, Minecraft and Warmth of Home.

The students were tasked with greeting four busloads of tourists, some of which only spoke German. Other duties included handing out popcorn and cupcakes to visitors to the museum. There were also flying blue whales, stingrays and other colourful kites on display. We have received some really positive feedback from the Museum about how wonderful our students were on the day. 


YEAR 9 & 10 BOYS BADMINTON


