Otago University Advanced School Sciences Scholarship

The Science Academy is an exciting programme aimed at Year 13 students with a passion for science and the potential to excel in their final year NCEA and/or scholarship science exams. Awardees will attend two residential science camps on the University of Otago campus, a summer science camp in January and a winter science camp in July. Between science camps students work collaboratively in small teams on a science communication project to present at end of the July camp. Following the July camp students will be supported by online tutors who will present 10 online tutorials targeted at NCEA/scholarship physics, chemistry, and biology in the run up to external examinations at the end of the year.
