



Art Curriculum

This year the junior art curriculum has focused on the development of practical skills, exploring and using different elements, processes and techniques. Students have been encouraged to develop ideas individually, drawing on different modes of inspiration to create art works.



Students in year 7 & 8 have been drawing inspiration from their cultural heritage and exploring traditional kōwhaiwhai patterns. They have been exploring traditional patterns composing, carving, graffiti techniques and paint techniques. Students are collaboratively working on a large-scale project that celebrates the whakapapa and whanaungatanga of Ruawai College.

Students in year 9 & 10 completed modules looking at a range of artists, recreating and exploring techniques and styles. During the first module, students recreated landscapes taking inspiration from renowned NZ and international artist styles. The second module encompassed students exploring their uniqueness and creating Dennis Olsen fictive portraits in their image. They then developed their ideas in response to experiences and feelings and as they reflected on their own art making to create their final piece.

Mau Rakau

In Terms 3 and 4, we have been doing Mau Rākau with Whaea Awhina. Mau Rākau is a traditional Māori martial art and it has been a privilege to have had the opportunity to learn the ancestral practices and the values of a Māori warrior.

We have learned about the Māori culture and traditions, gained new skills and in the process got a good workout. It has been a great learning experience and our whaea provided a fun learning environment for us to discover what Mau Rākau is all about. I highly recommend Mau Rākau for up-and-coming students to take if given the opportunity. Some of the things I will take with me in my kete from Mau Rākau include:

- The origin of Mau Rākau.
- Māori weaponry.
- Sports, games, and training exercises
- Whakapapa and pepeha.
- Karakia.
- Knowledge, Tikanga, and values
- Stances, positions, strikes, body movements, facial expressions, blocks, and much more.

Every warrior needs to earn their taiaha and that is the aim of the Mau Rākau as well. Some students have met this goal, which has felt like a great accomplishment.

Mau Rākau is rich in culture and traditional practice. With the introduction of the Aotearoa Histories curriculum and a focus for secondary schools to better understand Matauranga Maori (knowledge of Maori and traditional concepts) Mau Rakau was introduced. In today's world we use the taiaha to revitalise wellbeing, identity and to foster a sense of belonging in our school.

A big shout out and thank you to Whaea Awhina, for all of the mātauranga that you have shown us and taught us. Thank you for all your mahi.


